

PARADISE BAY ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT PHASE II

Paradise Bay Road Phase II Improvement Project construction was completed in September, 2015. Located in the Port Ludlow area on Paradise Bay Road, the project began near the Spinaker Place intersection (Mile Post 0.37) and ended at the Teal Lake Road intersection (MP 1.53).

This 1.16-mile-long project preserved and rehabilitated the asphalt roadway surface, improved sight distance, and enhanced safety. Project elements included:

- ◆ widening and paving the shoulders to 4' wide,
- ◆ repaving the 11' wide lanes,
- ◆ lowering one roadway vertical curve to improve sight distance,
- ◆ constructing a right turn pocket,
- ◆ constructing drainage improvements, and
- ◆ installing guardrail, signage and pavement marking.

Lakeside Industries, Inc. of Port Angeles, WA constructed the project for \$1,106,556. Funding for the project was provided through a State Rural Arterial Program grant which paid for 90% of the improvements.



Improvements to this section of Paradise Bay Road include expanding the shoulders to 4' wide, then paving the new surface.



The newly rehabilitated Road provides a safe and smooth ride for residents and visitors.
