

RUN-OFF-ROAD & INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS

In November 2013, Jefferson County Public Works successfully completed numerous road and intersection improvements throughout East Jefferson County. The traffic upgrades will improve the safety and driving experience for residents and visitors to the Jefferson County community. Completed project work included installation of:

| Improvement | Detail | Total Installation |

| Traffic Signs | Larger and High Visibility | 770 signs |
| Street Name Signs | Larger and High Visibility | 320 signs |
| Rumble Strips | Provide advance warning of changing roadway conditions and hazards | 690 linear feet |
| Guardrail | At locations with steep embankments | 2,800 linear feet |
| Reflective Pavement Markers | Improve center-line delineation during night-time driving | 21 miles |

Petersen Brothers, Inc, of Sumner Washington constructed the project for the amount of \$501,358. The project was 100 percent grant funded by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and was completed on schedule and under budget.
